Any recognized breed of livestock owned by Lincoln County residents may be shown in this division, provided they are registered (except eligible weanlings in a breed association, or in the market classes). THE SUPERINTENDENT WILL CALL FOR REGISTRATION PAPERS. When only one animal is shown in a class it will be judged on its merits and placed accordingly.

**Calves need to be in place by Friday at 12:00 and the show begins at 1:00.**

For youth less than 8 years of age as of January 1. Youth must exhibit their calf in the show ring. Judging will consist of interviews conducted at that time.

Scoring will be based on the condition of the animal, evidence of training, knowledge of the animal (i.e. feeding, age, breed, training, plans for the calf after the fair, etc.) Scoring will NOT be based on the quality of the animal.

**DIVISION 5 - GOATS**

**108** Goat Showmanship Class for youth less than 8 years of age as of Jan. 1.

**Participation ribbon.** Although an eligible youth may borrow a goat for class 108 and enter the day of the show, participants in class 108 that bring their own goat must pre-register by pre fair entry deadline and bring the goat to fair on entry day during announced entry periods. Goats used only for class 108 will be released following the show.

**DIVISION 6 - POULTRY**

Sick or unhealthy animals will not be accepted. Pre-entered animals **must** be placed in the Poultry building on Wednesday by 5:00 p.m.



*Entry Limits: Each exhibitor may only enter a total of 8 pens/entries, this includes 1 market broiler pen and fowl pens. Also, within a species (chickens, ducks, geese, etc.) an exhibitor may only enter 2 birds per sex in one breed (2 cockerels, 2 pullets, 2 cocks, 2 hens). Each animal can only be shown in one division. Entries must be fed and watered. Exhibitor entries will be caged by the exhibitor NOT by breed. Cages and exhibits must be kept neat and clean or they will be dismissed from the show. Sick, unhealthy, or parasite infested birds will not be accepted. All birds will have an ID band, if you are in need of one please contact the Lincoln County Extension Office. **Birds must be shown by the Exhibitor whose name is on the entry card.** Any bird entered at the fair that becomes less than show quality can be excluded from judging. After judging, those not taken care of will not receive premium monies.*

## **DIVISION 7 – RABBITS**

Pre-entered animals should be brought to the Small Animal Building and placed by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday. Bring your own feeders and waterers.

All Rabbits must be properly identified. Rabbits will be divided according to breeds as recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association. Each exhibitor may only enter a total of 8 pens/entries, this includes 1 meat pen and 1 doe with litter. Also, an exhibitor may only enter 2 rabbits per sex in one breed (2 bucks, 2 does). Exhibitor entries will be caged by the exhibitor NOT by breed. Each animal can only be shown in one division.

Crossbred rabbits will be shown according to predominant breed characteristics. If unidentifiable, they will be shown in "other breeds" class.

## **DIVISION 8 - OPEN CLASS DOGS**

4-H & Open Class show will be held Monday beginning at 8:00 a.m. at the Beef Arena. This is an un-benched show; the procedures will be consistent with all 4-H rules. The eligibility and entry rules already set up for livestock in the Lincoln County Fair will apply to entries for the Dog Show. All dogs must be in training by the exhibitor by June 15 of the current year. Show Rules: The show will follow rules in the Nebraska 4-H Dog Shows Guidelines (4-H420)

<http://animalscience.unl.edu/companion-animal>.

Exhibitor may enter one showmanship, two agility classes (using two different dogs and in different levels), two rally classes (using different dogs and in different levels), and two obedience classes (using two different dogs and in different levels). **The name of the dog must appear on the pre-entry form. Any entry turned in without the name of the dog will NOT be accepted.**

**PROOF OF VACCINATION** All dogs must be immunized for distemper, rabies, and parvo. A copy of the immunization card must accompany entry cards. Individuals who vaccinate their own dogs must be able to show proof of vaccination. It is recommended dogs be vaccinated for kennel cough prior to show.

Female dogs in season will not be eligible to show. If a female dog is in season, exhibitors can substitute another dog, in appropriate classes. Dogs must be at least six months old to be shown. Dogs must be in crates or on a leash and under the control of their exhibitor at all times. Lamé or crippled dogs will not be permitted to show if it is determined by the show superintendent that it is affecting the health of the dog. If exhibits are not blue ribbon quality, championships will not be awarded.

## SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

Showmanship Classes will be judged on handler's appearance "10%", grooming and conditioning of dog "20%", coordination of the dog and handler "50%", and general knowledge "20%". Special coat trims (such as poodle or terriers) will not count except for being clean and neatly brushed.

## OBEDIENCE CLASSES

**BEGINNING NOVICE**-All exercises must be performed on a six-foot leash. Dogs must heel including figure 8; Stand for examination; come on recall; long sit for one minute and long down for three minutes.

- 102** Pre-Beginning Novice: Neither dog nor exhibitor has had previous training experience.
- 103** Beginning Novice A: Neither dog nor exhibitor has had previous training experience in or out the Dog project.
- 104** Beginning Novice B: Exhibitor or Dog is beyond the first year of competition.
- 105** Beginning Novice C: Exhibitor and dog is beyond first year of competition.
- 106** Novice A: Dogs must heel on leash including figure 8; stand for examination off leash, heel free; come on recall off leash; long sit for 1 minute off leash and long down for 3 minutes off leash.
- 107** Novice B: Exhibitor and dog are beyond first year of novice competition.
- 108** Graduate Novice: Dogs must heel on leash; stand for examination off leash; heel free including figure 8; drop on recall; long sit for 3 minutes and long down for 5 minutes both with handler out of sight.

## **AGILITY General Rules**

All dogs must wear a flat collar; no other type is allowed. Each dog may be exhibited by only one handler in agility competition. Handlers should wear closed toe shoes; tennis shoes are suggested. No baiting, toys or training devices are allowed on the course during competition. A class entry fee will be assessed per agility division. All fees are due at the pre-fair entry deadline. Fees are non-refundable. Scoring: Maximum score is 100 points. \*\*For more specific rules, refer to the Nebraska 4-H Dog Show Rules.

## **AGILITY CLASSES**

- 109** Pre-Agility Class: Dogs up to 18 months old. Same as Level 1 but jump bars will be on the ground.
- 110** Level 1: Six obstacles. (on leash) Dogs must be 18 months or older.
- 111** Level 2: Ten obstacles. (on leash)
- 112** Level 3: Ten obstacles
- 113** Level 4: Thirteen obstacles
- 114** Level 5: 15-20 obstacles

## **Agility Jump heights**

Measure dogs at withers to determine jump height:

- Dogs 11 inches or less – 4 inches
- Dogs over 11 inches up to and including 14 inches – 8 inches
- Dogs over 14 inches up to and including 18 inches – 12 inches
- Dogs over 18 inches – 16 inches

## **RALLY**

Listing of rally signs are available on the county website. A class entry fee will be assessed per rally class. All fees are due at the pre-fair entry deadline. Fees are non-refundable. Rally obedience is a dog performance class that uses directional signs that are numbered to indicate the course the handler is to follow during the performance. The team of dog and handler heel from sign to sign and perform the exercises indicated by the numbered sign at the location. At the start sign, the judge gives permission to start the courses and then the dog and handler go through the courses. The judge will say "Are you ready?" followed by "Forward." No other directives are given. The course consists of signs that instruct the team what to do. Unlike traditional obedience, handlers are allowed to encourage their dogs during the course. The number of stations/signs is noted below in the class description (start and finish signs are not included in the sign count and are automatically used). Signs may be duplicated and used more than one time to create the course.

PROCEDURE - Sequence and course map of the exercises will vary. The exhibitors will begin doing rally based on their level in obedience classes. Exhibitors must advance to the next level after receiving two blue ribbons. Jump heights are the same as agility classes.

## **Rally Classes**

- 115** Beginning Rally: Exercises are performed with dogs on leash with 5-10 stations. Exhibitors MUST BE entered in a Beginning Novice Obedience class.

- 116** Rally 1: Dog on leash with 10-15 stations.  
**117** Rally 2: Dog is off leash with 12-17 stations.  
**118** Rally 3: Dog is off leash with 15-20 stations.

## **DEPARTMENT A FLORAL and PLANTS**

All garden flowers and potted plants must be grown by the exhibitor. Artistic arrangements **MUST** be arranged by the exhibitor, (Youth & Adult Divisions) but plant material used need not be grown by the arranger. Dried and/or treated plant material is permitted but no artificial foliage or flowers are permitted. Accessories permitted in all artistic arrangements unless otherwise stated. Please bring the correct amount.

The exhibit must have been grown by the exhibitor unless otherwise stated.

Exhibitors must furnish their own suitable containers (no Styrofoam containers) for cut flowers.

When entering more than one entry in a class, they are to be listed as A, B, and C, etc. (*Example: Hybrid Rose, A Red, B White and C Pink*) Please place in separate containers; all entries will receive a ribbon. When entered as the example you can exhibit a mixture of plants in one class that you would

otherwise not be able to. Any questions please ask the Floral Superintendent. Exhibitors will need to furnish water for your own containers, no leaves below the water line, and please use the appropriate-sized container for your entry.

### **Amateurs ONLY – PLEASE!**

Grand Champion is eligible for "Best in County" at the State Fair NEXT year. You need to get a form signed by the Chairman of Open Class.

Entries that have been entered before are not eligible. The entries must have been taken within the last 2 years. There will only be one Champion & Reserve Champion chosen for the cell phone photos. The Enhanced Division: Changing only exposure, saturation, shadows, contrasts and color.

The Manipulated Division: The photo is changed to make it "fake". Changing the photo to watercolor, oil painting, etc.

### **Exhibit Preparation Requirements:**

**Photo size:** all photos must be 8"x10" or 11"x14" (11"x15" permitted only if the printing service cannot convert print to the 14" and then must have heavy backing).

**Backing:** All photos 8"x10" or 11"x14" must be mounted on 11"x14" mounting board that is at least 1/8" thick and not more than 1/4" thick to fit on the display board. Do not use cardboard, foam board or other lightweight backing. Photos may be mounted with 3M Spray-On Photo Mount, liquid glue or two-sided tape completely around the entire board. Note, however, that old two-sided tape may not be reliable. Any photos not securely mounted will be removed from competition and display.

**Mats:** Mats are optional but recommended if photo is 8"x10". If mats are used, they must be 11"x14" and must be firmly attached. Use quality Mounting Tapes or glues that are available at most art supply stores and frame shops. Two-sided tape must be completely around the mat. Again, old two-sided tape may not be reliable.

**No metallic paper.**

**Title card:** With the photo face down, place the title card on the upper right side of the back of the photo backing. The title card must be no larger than 3" X 5" and be mounted so that no more than 2" is visible above the photo when viewed from the front of the photo. All classes should have a title on the title card. The title of the entry should be short: one to four words in length. The entry title written on the title card taped to the board back must be visible on the left front of the photo.

**Identification:** Identify your photo by placing the following information on the back of the entry:

Exhibitor's Name

City- Phone #

Title

Division and Class #

Editing used (software, auto settings, cropping, curves or brushes, HDR, etc)

Check rules for Advanced Amateur or Amateur.

**Presentation:** All photos must be unframed. Do not cover with cellophane, acetate or glass. There should be no hooks, wires or hangers attached to the photo.

**Judging:** Photography exhibits will be judged according to the following criteria: technique, composition, impact, originality, print & mounting quality, and overall presentation.
